
NORTHERN BREWER

Origin: Germany. An offspring of Brewer's Gold with some ancestry from an American wild hop, this English-bred high alpha variety later found favor and acreage all over the world. In Germany it is known primarily as a bittering hop.

Usage: Dual purpose. Germangrown Northern Brewer has a more noble and less pungent profile than when grown elsewhere, which makes



it suited to a variety of traditional European styles where a strong or "American" hop signature may not be appropriate - German lagers, Belgian and Trappist ales, farmhousestyle beers.

Aroma & Flavor Characteristics: Predominantly spicy with an undercurrent of woods and wild fruit, suggestive of its Brewer's Gold parentage. Overall balanced with lasting flavor that reads as simply "hoppy" - not as outright woodsy and bright as US-grown Northern Brewer.
